

<p><u>Year 3 Spring Term 2021</u></p> <p>Here is our topic for the second half term. Please use this information to support your children's learning.</p>		<p>As Writers: We shall be writing our own myth based on tradition stories from around the world in our book, 'Myth Atlas' and looking into the way our brain works using, 'The Book of the Brain'.</p>	
<p>As Artists:</p> <p>We shall use model making techniques to create a small-scale Stone Age village with mixed media. We shall also be using printing techniques.</p>	<p>As Linguists:</p> <p>We will be learning to say all about myself in French, saying colours, actions, clothes, body parts and instructions.</p>	<p>As Computer Technicians:</p> <p>We will investigate how computer networks work, through passing messages across networks and testing network connections.</p>	<p>As Musicians:</p> <p>We will be learning 'The Dragon Song'. This is a song about kindness, respect, friendship, acceptance and happiness. It will include Listening & Appraisal; progressive Warm-up Games, Flexible Games and improvisation with composition.</p>
<p>As Mathematicians: We shall be studying 'Length and Perimeter', using our measuring skills along with addition and subtraction. After that we shall be studying fractions with halves, quarters and thirds, equivalent fractions, unit and non-unit fractions and counting in fractions. This term will include catch up work related to the four operations.</p>	<p><u>The Big Question:</u></p> <p>Who first lived in Britain?</p> 		<p>In Forest School:</p> <p>We shall be thinking about how Stone Age people used to build shelters and trying it out using the resources we find around us.</p>
<p>As Athletes:</p> <p>We will be looking at tennis, thinking about racket skills, ball control and placing ourselves ready to make contact. We will also consider how physical activity keeps us fit and how it affects our body.</p>	<p>As Citizens:</p> <p>We shall continue with our 'Take a Break' sessions uploaded on Google Classroom.</p> <p>We will also be having World Book Day on the week beginning 15th March. We'll be dressing up under the umbrella theme, 'Anything Goes' and looking at the story of Alice's Adventures in Wonderland.</p>	<p>As Historians:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • What jobs do archaeologists do and why are they so valuable in helping us find out about history? • How did the Early Britons make shelters? • Would the Early Britons have visited a supermarket for their food? • What can you find out about the Stone, Bronze and Iron Ages? • What do we know about the life styles of the Early Britons through the art they produced? • How do you think the Early Britons would have communicated? • Reflection: Working in groups the children put together an ICT presentation of the life of Early Britons taking account of their weapons, food, ways of communicating and eating.
