As Scientists we will:

Describe the differences in the life cycles of a mammal, amphibian, insect and bird.

Describe the life process of reproduction in some plants and animals.

*Describe the life cycles of plants.
Explore the work of well-known naturalists and animal behaviourists.*

As Citizens we will:

Explore how to keep ourselves safe, happy and healthy.
