Dear Parents and Carers,

Happy New Year! It is wonderful to see everyone back at school after the festive break and to hear about all of the lovely experiences that have been had. We are sure to be hitting the ground running and continuing to explore some more fresh and fascinating topics. We have again, already booked some exciting trips and experiences to take our learning out of the classroom and inspire everyone to achieve more. Expectations continue to be at their highest as the children continue in their various roles of responsibility in the school and we are looking forward to seeing the positive impact we know they will have on our whole school community. We will continue to support the children in developing their independence, in readiness for moving onto secondary school.

School Day

We would like to remind you that the gates to school open at 08:45 and the register is taken at 08:55. The children begin learning activities as soon as they walk through the door, so we really do appreciate your support in ensuring they arrive promptly to maximise learning time. The school day ends at 15:20 (with gates opened for parents to enter the playground at 15:15)

Uniform and belongings

Full school uniform, including smart, plain-black shoes (not trainers), is to be worn every day apart from PE days when children can attend in their PE kit. Long hair must all be tied back. Please note that the wearing of nail varnish and any jewellery (apart from stud earrings) is not permitted in school. We would love to see the children proudly wearing their house point star badges and any other responsibility badges they may have.

Please ensure your child has a raincoat with them every day, as the weather can be somewhat unpredictable and that all of their belongings are clearly labelled.

During the sunnier weather, please ensure your child has sun cream applied and has a sun hat to wear.

Snacks and Drinks

Children must have a water bottle in school every day which can be refilled if needed. Children can bring a fruit or vegetable snack to school to eat at breaktime.

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Spellings

We will be continuing to use Spelling Frame to support children in learning and practising their spellings as well as for a weekly test. This is accessible online from home too (login details can be found in your child's reading record). Spelling tests will happen every Thursday and the next week's words will then be available.

Accelerated Reader

Another online platform that we will again be using is Accelerated Reader. The children complete a short assessment each half term to ensure that the books they are choosing are of an appropriate level of challenge for them enabling them to be both improving and enjoying their reading. Children are expected to quiz on any books that they read as soon after they finish as possible – they are given daily opportunities to do this. Every quiz score sees them moving closer to their reading points target, gaining certification levels and adding to their wordcount. We will be awarding prizes for those that read the most words each term.

Reading

Ideally, children should be reading daily (for around 15 minutes) but at a minimum, four days a week. Please ensure that they record this in their reading diary which will be checked on a weekly basis (on a Monday) and house points will be awarded to those that meet and exceed these expectations.

Our termly book clubs will continue to take place this year, as well as the Author Island Adventure. More information will be sent out about this shortly.

PE

This term, we will continue to have two days that children need to come to school in their PE kit – Monday and Tuesday.

A reminder that our school PE kit is:

- Plain black shorts/tracksuit bottoms (**not grey**)
- Plain house-coloured t-shirt
- Trainers
- School jumper

Outdoor Learning

We will continue to have outdoor learning sessions planned for most Thursday afternoons. Please ensure that your child brings to school with them, sensible outdoor clothing that covers their arms and legs (and may well get dirty) to change into. In cold/wet weather, the sessions will still go ahead so a warm, waterproof coat is needed and waterproof trousers can be worn too. Please also ensure that they always have wellies (packed in a sturdy bag) for these sessions.





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Homework

Homework will continue to be set on a Thursday and due in on a Wednesday. Activity details will be posted on Google Classroom each week and will often contain links to online learning platforms such as MyMaths and Education City.

The children are also expected to practise their spellings and times tables on a daily basis – TTRockstars and Spelling Frame can be used for this.

Mobile Phones

We understand that some children have a mobile phone with them to enable them to communicate on their journeys to and from school. We would appreciate your help in reminding your child to hand this in to the teacher on arrival at school, to be stored safely and they will be returned to them at the end of the school day. Please ensure that we have received an email for this too.

End of day collection

At the end of the day, safety is our priority. It is important for you to inform us of any changes to end of day arrangements.

We are looking forward to continuing to enjoy teaching and learning with Sycamore Class this term.
